LEARN THE MUSICAL LANGUAGE

Our friend Arby the Tree has dropped a few of the words we use in music that might help you understand the music better!

CONDUCTOR

The person who leads the orchestra, using hand motion to guide how the orchesta should sound

the primary tune of the piece

DYNAMICS

MELODY

the changes in the loudness and softness of the music

HARMONY

the supporting notes that join together with the melody to make a pleasing sound

the patterns of sounds and silence

RHYTHMN
