Join Music Director Carolyn Kuan and the HSO on a musical journey through the lens of American composers. Enjoy the spectacular sounds of Grofé's Grand Canyon Suite and the "simple gifts" of Copland's Appalachian Spring Suite - both are included on NPR's list of the 100 most important American Musical compositions of the 20th century. Be inspired by Valerie Coleman's new work. Seven O'Clock Shout, an anthem dedicated to frontline workers and the cheers given to them from the windows of NYC residents. Any American Adventure would not be complete without Gershwin's An American in Paris, the piece that was inspired by his trip to Paris.

> Claude Debussy's beloved and unforgettable piano pieces Clair de lune and Nocturnes are transformed for orchestra. Debussy's music perfectly embodies an ever-changing and carefree feeling. Pianist Alessio Bax joins the HSO to perform Maurice Ravel's Piano Concerto for the Left Hand, a piece composed for Austrian pianist, Paul Wittgenstein, who lost his right arm during WWI. Mason Bates' Liquid Interface is a piece inspired by bodies of water, showing the magnificent power of the element in all forms.

> The Minnesota based breakdance group BRKFST takes the Belding stage. Founded in 2014, BRKFST is a collaborative ensemble that combines breaking movement with contemporary dance. You will be captivated by the group's new choreography set to Beethoven's Grosse Fuge, and DBR's eclectic Dancers, Dreamers, and Presidents - a piece that won the 2010 Sphinx commissioning prize. In addition, the orchestra will perform *Immerse*, a piece composed by the Joyce C. Willis Artist in Residence, Ouinn Mason.

The creation and premiere of this new work by BRKFST Dance Company set to "Dancers, Dreamers and Presidents" by Daniel Bernard Roumain was made possible by the New England Foundation for the Arts' National Dance Project, with lead funding from the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation and the Mellon Foundation

> Pianist Terrence Wilson performs what can be considered one of the greatest and most romantic works in the piano repertoire, Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 2. While nursing a broken foot, Florence Price composed Symphony No. 1 in E minor, her first full orchestral composition on record. Price's Symphony was the first symphony composed by a Black woman to be performed by a major orchestra, the Chicago Symphony Orchestra in 1932.




The 25th Annual Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival Hartford-Organ Extravaganza

The performance will highlight The Bushnell's rarely heard Austin organ, with its 5,409 pipes installed into the mammoth sidewalls of Mortensen Hall. 
OCTOBER 29, 2022 • 3PM HSO'S Tales of Halloween

The Hartford Symphony Orchestra has selected Quinn Mason as the Joyce C. Willis Artist in Residence for the 2022-2023 season, made possible through a generous grant from The Edward C. and Ann T. Roberts Foundation. Mason is the first of three one-year artists in residence named. As part of his residency with the HSO, Mason is writing a new piece for orchestra that will be premiered at the closing concert of the 2022-2023 Masterworks Series season in June. In addition, he will be working with the Learning & Social Impact department on community and education initiatives with HSO partners throughout Hartford.


